Plant of the Month Rhododendron 'Pink Pinwheels'

By Don Wallace Created by Frank Fujioka of Whidbey Island, and famous for being the creator of such award winning rhododendrons as 'Seaview Sunset', 'Pomegranate Splash', and 'Starbright Champagne'. This new plant was registered with the American Rhododendron Society just a couple of years ago, and has some amazing qualities. Rhododendron 'Pink Pinwheels' is a cross of Rhododendron 'Flirt' x Rhododendron 'Noyo Chief'. The first parent R. 'Flirt' is a Rhododendron yakushimanum hybrid, so brings in some dwarfing characteris-

tics, while the other parent, R. 'Noyo Chief" imparts shiny foliage characteristics. The plant will grow to 3 ft. tall and 4-5 ft. wide in 10 years. In some shade the leaves will be extraordinary! Here is foliage that is shiny and a very dark green that holds for 3-4 years, making it a very full plant. The flowers are very much 'pink pinwheels', with the overlapping pink and white wavy edges reminiscent of a colorful pinwheel spinning on the end of a stick. We are fortunate to be able to acquire these new rhododendrons and share them with our members.

It is **Show Time! April 27 to 29** at St. Bernard's Elementary School at 115 Henderson in Eureka. Come buy plants, see the show flowers including the Bonsai Society's display and watch the Rhododendron Parade.

The 40th Annual Rhododendron Show and Plant Sale

Lots of buds but not much time left. We would really like to have at least **3 trusses from each member**. Can you imagine how wonderful the tables will look??

Location: Miles Hall, St. Bernard's Elementary School at 115 Henderson Street, Eureka, California.

Open to the public: Saturday April 28th from 10 to 4 and Sunday April 29th from 10 to 3:30. Your friends, relatives, neighbors and the public are encouraged to enter trusses.

Trusses will be accepted for display from 6 PM until 9 PM on Friday and from 7 AM until 9 AM on Saturday. No entries will be accepted after 9 AM.

Set up will begin at 3:00 PM on Friday the 29th for those of you who are planning to help. We will need the most help with filling the bottles for the trusses. You can also bring your trusses, plants, educational displays, flower arrangements and photos at that time but they will not be accepted for display until 6 PM. Be sure they have plenty of water and the stems are cut long enough to allow the most water to get into the truss. Sheets will be ready for covering the tables and risers.

For the plant sale: helping hands will be needed to unload the trailer full of plants. Tim and Don will be there to unload and supervise.

Anyone can enter trusses and plants. If you have a special plant that can be dug or is in a pot, bring it in. Also, don't forget there is an Education category. We have had some really interesting displays in the past. The photography has been a well-filled section. Be sure the photos are matted and not framed. Carol Dunning will be happy to receive any and all entries for the flower arrangements. We should have that table at the front of the hall simply full of arrangements. Remember, that if you don't believe your flowers are "good enough" for judging, bring them anyway. They will look great as examples of the type of rhododendron they are. They can also fill in the spaces on the tables after the judging. We need all we can get.

The **Bonsai Society** will be sharing our show space again this year for added appeal.

This is a great time for everyone to participate, bring your family, friends and neighbors. People who join will be able to have their **choice of a free one-gallon plant** from the plant sale for their paid thru 2013 membership!


"As a "dragee" to the Eureka Chapter of the American Rhododendron Society, you have been an important part of the chapter's activities.
